On the lower mezzanine floor comes the kitchen, dining room and open balcony. On the lower ground is the living room that leads to a wooden patio overlooking the hills.

The doorway is decorated with tinted glass that complements the brick walls and tiles flooring. At the top of the doorway sits a magnificent piece of timber block that comes in whole and forms part of the entrance. ◀ Kitchen Gallery

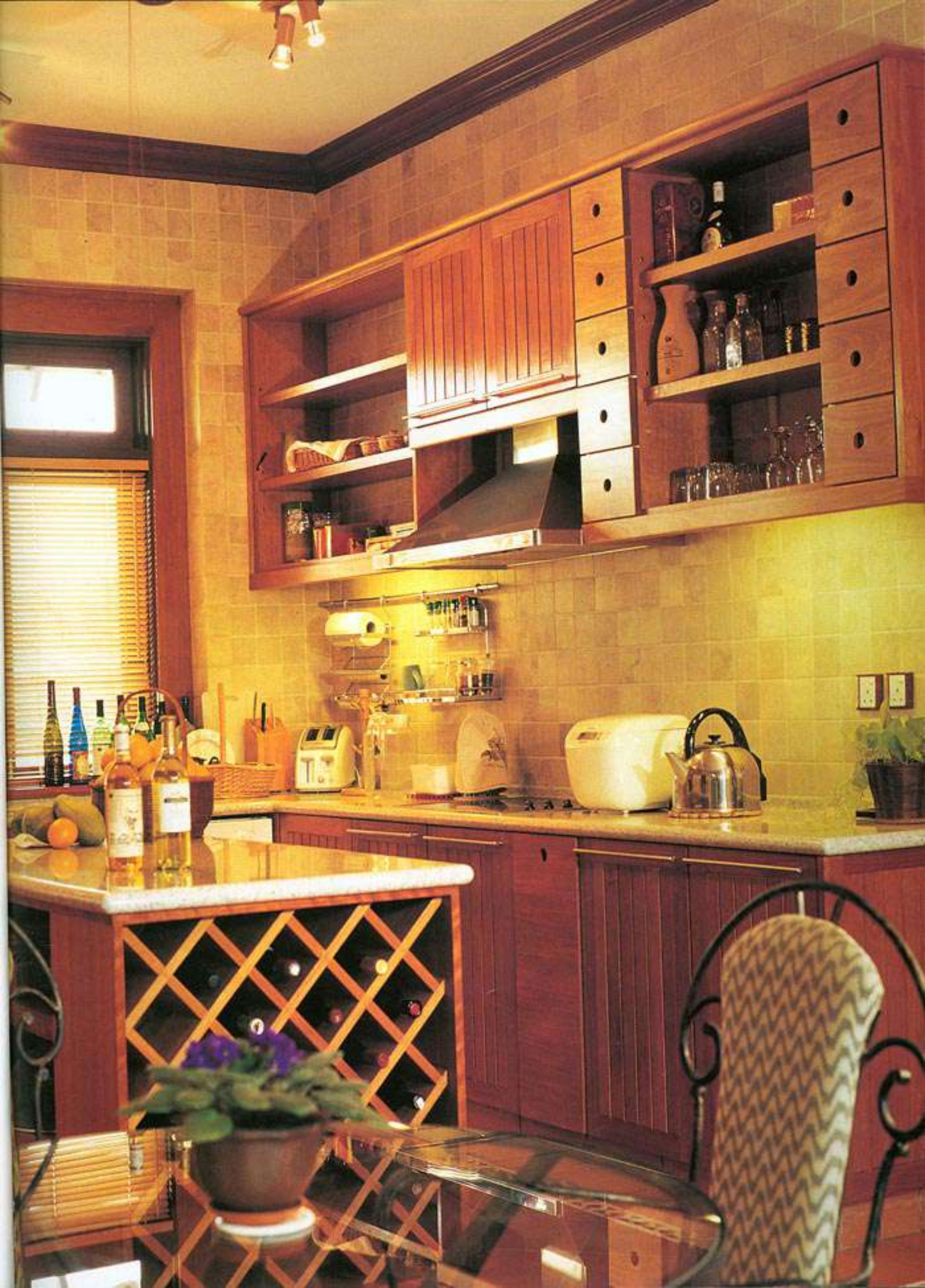
Cool open kitchen area just below the music room surrounded by green varieties. A favourite spot for wine drinking and good conversation just outside the reach of direct sunlight.
