Kitchen Gallery


Cool open kitchen area just below the music room surrounded by green varieties. A favourite spot for wine drinking and good conversation just outside the reach of direct sunlight.

The Balinese cabinet at the top of the stairs has been adopted to add character and to greet with its charm.












What's For Lunch
